February 6, 2013

The Merrill Parks and Recreation Commission met on Wednesday, February 6, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. at the City Hall in the Council Chambers.

Visitors: Dave Johnson, Fred Heider, Kandy Peterson, Phynette Conrad, Brenda Mamer, Goergjett Hoffmann, Allen Hoffmann, Samantha Pinego, Bonnie Noonan, Mary Ball, Steven Roets, Darrell Barker, Jack Ader, David Hayes, Dale Rasmussen, Sharon Anderson, Marty Anderson, Judy Woller, Mile Wilson, June Barker, Christine Vorpapel, Dr. Steve Dahm and a few other came in at the start of the meeting.

\*\*\*Motion by Artac, seconded by Caylor, to approve the minutes from the previous meeting.

\*\*\*Carried unanimously.

\*\*\*Motion by Hintze, seconded by Artac, to approve the claims.

\*\*Sturm questioned what the \$1,500.00 was for. Wendorf stated it was for the wedding show at the Smith Center.

\*\*Caylor questioned what the tree keeper subscription was and how many free trees we received for that amount of money. Wendorf stated it was for the online subscription for forestry management software and no free trees.

\*\*\*Carried Unanimously.

\*\*\*Motion by Caylor, seconded by Willman, to open the meeting into a public hearing for the 2013 – 2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan.

Chairperson Novitch asked Mr. Heider from NCWRPC to summarize the process for the public. Chairperson Dan Novitch invited any of the public to come up and speak on behalf of the 2013 – 2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan.

\*\*Christine Vorpapel, stated she met with Mr. Wendorf prior to the meeting, state there was a couple typo's in the brochure, is in favor of the River Bend Trail, would like to see Normal Park as a rental park because it is very hard to plan anything there with no reservations being taken. Would like to see the city and Lincoln County work together as far as the grand stands go.

\*\*Bonnie Noonan, is in favor of the River Bend Trail but does not want to see snowmobiles on it and does not want it lighted. Is opposed to the dog park in the city limits, wants to know who will be responsible for the dog park.

\*\*Steve Dahm, is in favor of the River Bend Trail, promotes exercise in the community, supported fully by medical staff, city needs to showcase what we have. Will not cost the city any money, all funds done by grants, federal funding and fundraising.

\*\*Steve Roets in favor of the River Bend Trail. High School Senior and he feels Merrill needs these things if in future years they want to bring back some of the college students for a great community to live in.

**\*\*Sharon Anderson, is in favor of the plan and feels that the River Bend Trail would enhance the City of Merrill drawing more people into the community. Feels we need to keep marketing the city in order for people to want to move here.**

**\*\*Al Hoffman, owner of land up to railroad tracks over by Lincoln Wood Products and wants to know who would be responsible if the wall that is up would fall.**

**\*\*Dave Johnson, stated that the city concluded the survey taken and two of the biggest themes of the survey was the Wisconsin River and Prairie River. Concerns on lack of access to the water and not enough trails in the City of Merrill. Johnson is in favor of the trails but at this point does not see the city paying for any, would like to use some money from the timber sales to help upgrade some of the trails in the community. Also would like to see some trails made in the Memorial Forest.**

**\*\*\*Motion by Hintze, seconded by Caylor to close the public hearing regarding the 2013-2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan.**

The next item on the agenda was to review/approve 2013-2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan. Hintze stated that he was very happy to hear all the input from the public and thanked them for coming. Caylor reminded everyone that just because there is a project in the 2013-2018 Outdoor Recreation Plan it does not mean that the project will be completed or even started.

**\*\*\*Motion by Willman, seconded by Artac, to approve the 2013 – 2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan.**

**\*\*\*Carried unanimously.**

The next item on the agenda was to review/approve Resolution of Support with the River District Development Foundation. Wendorf stated that the River District was not asking for money in the Resolution of Support, just wanted the blessing of the Park and Recreation Commission. Sturm stated that the River Bend Trail Foundation needed to provide a map of where the trail is going and where it ends. Sturm was also concerned about where the trail will go behind the cosmo and over by Lincoln Wood Products. Sturm stated he is in favor of the trail but there are too many questions on the trail and the foundation should have the answers before coming to the Park and Recreation Commission. Sturm also stated that the foundation has to take the Resolution of Support to the City Council for approval. Sturm stated that they would be better off working with the City Council than the Park and Recreation Department, there is not enough manpower in the Park and Recreation Department to assist with writing the grants or maintenance of the trails. Caylor stated the foundation needs a starting point. Hintze stated that making the Resolution of Support is the starting point. Willman stated the resolution would make it so the foundation can work with the city. Willman also stated there are maps of where the trail will be going. Caylor stated that she would rather see the City do the negotiations with the Railroad Company for the Right of Way Property since in the end it would be the City signing on the dotted line.

**\*\*\*Motion by Willman, seconded by Hintze, to approve the Resolution of Support with the River District Development Foundation and forward it to City Council for approval.**

**\*\*Carried: Willman, Novitch, Hintze, Harris, Sturm, Artac**

**\*\*Opposed: Caylor**

The next item on the agenda was to review/approve application for Prairie Trails Park Adoption from Washington Elementary School. Wendorf stated that the adopt a park program was

established 8 years ago. Wendorf said the program is wonderful and very beneficial to both parties. Caylor questioned if the Park department supplied them with any equipment or cleaning stuff. Wendorf stated they take them garbage bags, rakes and garbage pickers. Wendorf stated this is a great thing for the community.

\*\*\*Motion by Hintze, seconded by Caylor to approve application for Prairie Trails Park Adoption from Washington Elementary School.

Novitch stated that there are several other parks in the community for adoption also.

The next item on the agenda was the continued discussion on the dog park. Wendorf stated that he included several options in the packet that everyone received. Wendorf stated that he has been checking on other communities with dog parks and have not heard of anyone complaining about them. Wendorf stated that he will be sitting down with the dog park group and talking about selection of area where the best fit in the community the dog park would be. Wendorf stated that some rules and regulations would need to be up for the dog park and that is another thing he would like to go over with the dog park group. Willman questioned if the Memorial Forest would work for the dog park, stating it would be nice for the animals to have a shaded area and things to run around, and would be easy to expand. Wendorf stated the Memorial Forest is about 12 miles out of town. Wendorf stated that he will have more information at the next meeting.

The next item on the agenda was to request to purchase Top Dresser with funds coming from Merrill Memorial Forest Salvage timber sale revenue. Wendorf stated that he was interested in getting a top dresser for many years. Wendorf stated that this would be a great investment for the ball fields to improve quality of play. Artac stated that it would not only be for the ball fields but it could also be used in parks to smooth and level out the grass areas to remove divots. Wendorf suggested getting the Turfco Model for \$8,495.00. Sturm questioned if that one would be big enough for all the fields and why Wendorf wouldn't go with the 2.25 yard.

\*\*\*Motion by Sturm, seconded by Artac, to approve the Turfco XL Top Dresser with a 2.25 cubic yard hopper for \$13,995.00. Money would come from Timber Salvage Sale from Memorial Forest.

\*\*\*Carried unanimously.

The next item on the agenda was monthly reports by Wendorf. Wendorf thanked everyone for coming to the public hearing and also for the involvement in the 2013-2018 City of Merrill Outdoor Recreation Plan. Wendorf also stated that this is a draft for guidance only and not everything in the plan will be completed. Winterfest went good and already planning to ad some more events for next year. Getting ready for recreational programs for summer.

\*\*\*Motion by Willman, seconded by Artac, to approve the monthly report given by Wendorf.

\*\*\*Carried unanimously.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for March 6, 2013 at 4:15 p.m., in the lower level in the conference room at City Hall.

Public Comment: Darrell Barker would like to see more meeting held later in the evening. It is very difficult to get to the meeting at 4:15 p.m. Barker stated that even if every other meeting was held later that would be good for more people.

### March 2013 Parks & Recreation Director Board Report

**Parks:** With more winter like conditions over the past 3-4 weeks we were finally able to keep our outdoor rinks open for a consistent period of time. We have had some good participation at our rinks as well which is nice to see as that is what they are there for. We have also had to do quite a bit of snow removal over the past few weeks, with a fair amount of snowfalls requiring removal. It does take our two guys a fair amount of time to remove all of our required areas. I have been working with Becher Hoppe on all of our 2013 park projects. We have a lot going on this year for projects and I am hoping to space them out so we can finish them all in a staggered fashion to allow for a little flexibility. I would like to have the pool on the next agenda to discuss potential site(s), designs, limitations, etc. One of the things I have asked Becher Hoppe to help us with is feasibility of three sites, including: MARC, Stange Park, and Streeter Square. With this I am hoping to be able to actually answer the questions of flood plain issues, permitting, soil samples, parking, and other issues that may exist. I have heard many rumors floating around and to date that is all they are. A feasibility study will put that to rest and allow us to proceed further with factual information. I have also begun discussions with Lincoln County about the potential of connecting the Memorial Forest with Prairie Dells Park with trail developments. I am asking for support to write a Stewardship Grant to help with this project at the Memorial (City) Forest. I have also had discussions regarding this potential project with our local WDNR office as well and they would be willing to assist us with it as well. I have met with and received a donation from the Merrill Flower Garden Group and the Hanging Flower Basket Committee to move forward with the purchase of the new Gravely flower watering UTV. This will allow us to get the machine prepped and ready for the start of the "watering season." I have also begun laying out plans for our staff and summer staff for summer projects. Some of these projects will include trail improvements and enhancements at the MARC, Prairie Trails, Gebert Park, Riverside Park, Athletic Field improvements, re-sealing some of our wood exterior facilities, and some landscaping/visual enhancements to key areas, to name a few. I received a call from the Gebert Family in regards to their disapproval for a dog park in Gebert Park. They reiterated their families' interest in the park remaining a Nature Conservancy, as stated in the original deed to the City. Within the next few weeks, whenever the weather becomes more spring like, the crew will have their work cut out for them with park clean up, athletic field prep, park facility prep, and other tasks to get ready for the parks to be open.

**Forestry:** I attended our quarterly Urban Foresters Networking Meeting at the WDNR Regional Office in Rib Mountain on Wednesday, February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2013. As usual, these are always very enlightening as it gives all of us foresters an opportunity to share information with each other. A topic that has been towards the top of everyone's list has been Emerald Ash Borer. We are also going to be participating in some EAB trapping here to help with early detection (hopefully we don't find anything). I will be starting to patrol the streets inspecting hazard trees very soon as the snow banks recede. I do know that this

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year we are going to see a little more stress than usual on our street trees simply due to the fact that we have had drought like conditions in our area for at least 3 consistent growing seasons. Trees are very tolerant for the most part, but young and old trees cannot handle consistent drought conditions without showing symptoms. Our Tree City USA recognition and Arbor Day Celebration will be held on Friday, May, 10<sup>th</sup>. I would like to invite everyone on the Commission and Council to try and attend. I will provide more details in April.

**Recreation:** We are getting closer to finalizing spring and summer plans. We are trying to once again focus on improving our existing programs while sprinkling in new programming for more ages. The bus trips have been very successful for us over the past few years and we intend to offer a few more of those again this year. With the bus trips we are able to offer a service to a wider audience that we can typically handle. We had a banner recreation year in 2013 and it is our goal to exceed that this year. Once we are ready to roll out our complete line up we will ensure to promote as much as we can to get registrations moving.

**Smith Center:** We have a few weeks of ice left inside the arena. Last day of ice will be March 17<sup>th</sup>, allowing us less than a week to remove the ice, clean the arena and be ready for the Wedding Expo on March 24<sup>th</sup>. We have a very busy start to the dry floor season with Children's Expo, Wedding Expo, Ladies Lifestyle Expo, Business & Trade Show, Easter Egg Hunt, and a new Dance Tour Show. This only takes us to the end of April, so that is a great way to begin the season. We have already had our hot water heater replaced between locker rooms 4 & 5 as part of our Capital Equipment replacement here at the Center. As soon as the weather gets warmer we intend to replace the two heating units that were budgeted for replacement. We have had a great number of walkers inside the arena since the start of the year and that is great to see more people out here all day long. We had some minor troubles with our new Marquee Sign that have been remedied by the company under warranty, so hopefully we have all of the bugs worked out. It had been running perfectly fine up until a week or so ago and it is running fine now.







keep in mind, those squares are just 'ideas'. I do not have the original CSM, but I would guess that we have the original survey map from when we did the TIF or when we did the specific TIF developers agreement for Zastrows. I believe pretty much at the time only 10 acres of the 40 was buildable, so there was the lot that zastrows built on, and another smaller lot just north of them. I believe it was pretty much the whole west side of the parcel was sludge landfill and or drainage/wetland, and deemed un-buildable. (again, all from memory of my time on council and RDA).

If we get something going north of zastrow, and get pine ridge through to the north, then having that dog park i think really brings a 'park-y' feel to the east side of town, and I think is a good use of the land that is undeveopable in other ways, rather than it's current 'scruffy/vacant grass/scrubbrushy parcel it is now.'

it can still be a vacant, scrub-brushy area, but we could grade, put down some gravel, and maybe a single streetlap for the parking area, also get some tree's planted maybe, have some dirtpiles built and sodded for elevation/running, grade a couple trails, put up a couple benches/rest stations (similar to prairie trails). It would at least be 'controlled' vacant land, rather than just 'junk' vacant land. (I'm not sure if we'd need a fence around the whole thing)? would we?

anyway, those are my thoughts,







# Information and Use Regulations

The City of Sun Prairie along with the Sun Prairie Parks & Public Works Department are pleased to offer this facility to the residents of Sun Prairie and Dane County. The Pet Exercise Area was dedicated and opened for use on May 7, 1997.

The Sun Prairie Pet Exercise Area is designated to compliment the pet exercise areas or dog parks under the jurisdiction of the Dane County Parks Department and will have the same use regulations as those areas. The annual permit that you purchased will be valid in all Dane County dog parks as well as the Sun Prairie Pet Exercise Area.



**Directions:** The Pet Exercise Area is located south of Sheehan Park on South Bird Street. Proceed south over the railroad tracks and go over the top of the hill. The facility is located on the left and is marked with signage.

**Description:** Located on 11 acres of land on the City's former landfill site, the Pet Exercise Area is equipped with parking for 32 cars, picnic tables, benches, fencing, and waste disposal bags. There is also water and a portable restroom available. A mowed trail will supplement taller grasses on the site. In 2009, a separate small/timid dog area was added within the existing facility. This is located directly south of the parking lot and is completely fenced in, and has a separate entrance.

**Ordinances:** Because City ordinances do not allow pets in any City park, it is our hope that pet owners will use this facility on the permit basis that is available. City park staff has the ability to enforce the "No pets in the parks" ordinance and also enforces the annual and daily permit system that is in place at the Pet Exercise Area.

**Hours:** The Pet Exercise Area is open all year from dawn until dusk, seven days per week.

**Off-leash Area:** This is an off-leash facility which enables dog owners to properly exercise their pets.

**Identification:** Your pet must be licensed and should wear an owner ID tag.

**Vaccinations:** State law requires all dogs and cats to be vaccinated against rabies. Dog license or Pet Exercise Area permits will not be issued until this is completed.

**Permits:** In order to use the Sun Prairie Pet Exercise Area, an annual permit must be purchased for \$30.00. Additional tags for multiple dogs are available for \$14.00 each. Daily permits are available on a self-registration basis at the site for \$5.00 per day, per dog. You may obtain your annual permit in person at the City Clerk's Office in the Municipal Building, 300 East Main Street during regular office hours: Monday - Friday, 8:00 am - 4:30 pm. It is recommended that these permits be purchased when obtaining your annual dog license. Permits are valid from January 1 - December 31 of each year. By purchasing your permit through the City of Sun Prairie, the monies collected stay in the City of Sun Prairie for Pet Exercise Area!


**Control of Pets:** Owners must be inside the fenced in area and with their dog at all times. All off-leash pets must be under **complete** voice control of their owner. If you cannot control your pet off-leash, keep your pet leashed at all times for the safety of all users.


**Clean Up:** Dog waste at the facility is not only offensive, it can also spread disease and parasites to other pets and humans. Please clean up after your pet. Seal waste in a bag before disposing it in a designated receptacle at the site. Waste bags are provided free of charge for your use.

## Be Aware of HAZARDS

- Be aware that plants and fungi in the Pet Exercise Area may be poisonous to your pet.
- Vegetation may have burrs or seeds that could get tangled in your pet's coat or lodged in their feet, ears or eyes.
- Wild animals could injure your pet. Rabies infection is also a risk when pets encounter these animals. All pets should be vaccinated against rabies.
- "Batchers," or dog thieves have been known to nab unleashed pets when they are out of their owner's sight. Please watch your pet and always know where they are at.
- Dogs can easily become lost in large areas. In the winter their senses (especially sense of smell) become less keen because of the cold and snow.

**For these reasons, it is imperative that you always keep your pet under your supervision and voice control. If you have any questions or concerns, please call the Sun Prairie Parks & Public Works Department at 608-837-3050.**

## PARK RULES

Park hours are from 8 am to 10 pm

Dogs must be kept leashed except when they are inside the park.

Dogs must remain within sight of their handler at all times.

Handlers must have one leash per dog.

All dogs must be licensed and handler must have park use tag on them at all times.

Day use permits must be with the handler .

An attending adult must closely supervise all children inside the park.

Dogs must be leashed at the first sign of aggression or unruliness.

If your dog is not neutered or spayed, enter at own risk.

No more than 3 dogs per handler are permitted at one time in the park.

Dogs declared dangerous animals under city code , section 6-102, or dangerous or potentially dangerous dogs under State Statutes are not allowed in the park area.

Do not bring food or toys into the area. They may create a conflict.

Do not bring glass containers into the area.

Vaccinate dogs by the recommendation of your veterinarian.




The Doggie Park is located at the north end of Veterans Memorial Fields (the fairgrounds) behind the large Ag Building, 400 Superior St, Portage, WI.





DOGS UNDER 35 POUNDS AND PUPPIES UNDER 4 MONTHS ARE ENCOURAGED TO USE THE SMALL DOG AREA.

IF YOUR DOG IS NOT NEUTERED OR SPAYED ENTER AT YOUR OWN RISK.

HANDLERS MUST KEEP THE DOG'S LEASH WITH THEM WHILE IN THE PARK.

QUICKLY MOVE DEEPER INTO THE PARK AFTER RELEASING YOUR DOG.

STROLLERS, BIKES, SKIS, ROLLER BLADES & CHILDRENS TOYS ARE NOT ALLOWED INSIDE THE PARK.

FRISBEES, BALLS AND RETRIEVER TOYS ARE ALLOWED & ENCOURAGED, BUT BE PREPARED TO SHARE.

NO BAREFEET PLEASE...SHOES ARE REQUIRED.

NO FOOD, SMOKING OR GLASS CONTAINERS ALLOWED. ONLY SMALL DOG TREATS MAY BE USED INSIDE THE PARK.

CONTINUOUS BARKING IS FORBIDDEN.

HANDLER MUST BE IN THE PARK & IN CONTROL OF THE DOG AT ALL TIMES.

AGGRESSIVE DOGS MUST BE REMOVED IMMEDIATELY.

LET'S ALL WORK TO KEEP OUR PARK SAFE & CLEAN SO.... "SCOOP THE POOP & FILL THE HOLES."

ALL DOGS MUST HAVE A CURRENT DOG PARK PERMIT-DOG OWNERS WITHOUT A DOG PARK PERMIT WILL BE FINED.
