PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

November 2, 2016

The Merrill Parks and Recreation Commission met on Wednesday, November 2, 2016 at 4:15 p.m. at the Merrill City Hall.

***Motion by Sukow, seconded by Debroux to approve the minutes from the October meeting minutes.

***Carried unanimously.

***Motion by Sukow, seconded by Schroeder, to approve the claims.

***Carried Unanimously.

Public Comment: Heather O'Neill questioned if the commission members have had any more thoughts on the skateboard park. Willman stated that it is on the agenda for tonight.

The next item on the agenda was to discuss and finalize potential skate park locations to be considered at future public hearing. Sukow questioned if Dan Wendorf had a chance to speak with the county in regards to building on the current ice rink location at Memorial rink. Sukow also stated that he did not think the location where the old Legion building stands would be big enough for a skate park. Schroeder stated that they really need to analyze different locations for the skateboard park. Schroeder stated that parking needs to be considered so that would take both the Legion and Streeter Square out, since there is no parking at either location. Sukow suggested that at this time he doesn't feel a discussion can be made on location without having answers on the Memorial property and also without hearing from the DNR on the Stange Park Location.

***Motion by Schroeder, seconded by Sukow to put skate park locations on the agenda for December. Would also like to know what the agreement with the county and city is on the Memorial Rink area.

Heather O'Neill stated that the reason she chose a large size is so it can be divided up into beginners, moderate and advanced skaters. She wants this skateboard park to be special and it will be a big draw for a lot of people.

***Carried Unanimously.

The next item on the agenda was River Bend Trail project(s) update(s). Willman stated that City Administrator Dave Johnson has some information on the River Bend Trail. City Administrator Johnson stated that Mayor Bialecki, Gene Bebel and himself met last week in regards to the city taking over maintenance responsibilities for the River Bend Trail and no longer bill the

foundation. Johnson stated that when the original agreement for maintenance was made the trail was not a linear park as it is today and it only included Park St. on the east to Highway 64 on the west. The City will also seek approval to self-perform or pay for the base work for the trail from Kyes St. to Cooper St. with the Foundation paying for the paving. The City will also recommend that some amount of operational donation be made to the River Bend Foundation. City Administrator Johnson also stated the Housing Authority is applying for a grant to build a Veterans Home by the River Bend Trail which also has a great potential to bring in some small shops to the Merrill Community. This will be the only housing in Central WI for Veterans. City Administrator Johnson stated that they are looking for approval from the commission and also from the Council. Willman stated that on the agenda for December we will need to vote on the items brought before the commission. Willman stated for the agenda for December we will need all three items listed: 1. Motion to approve to take over maintenance responsibilities for the River Bend Trail, 2. Motion to approve city to self-perform or pay for the base work for the trail from Kyes St. to Cooper St. with the foundation paying for the paving. 3. Motion to approve an operational donation made to the River Bend Foundation. Sukow stated that when the council first brought up the River Bend Trail to the community the biggest concern was that it was going to be a burden on the tax payers and we the council at the time told them it would be at no cost to the taxpayers, but now we are going to change that and it will be a cost to the taxpayers. City Administrator Johnson stated that we will be getting more tax dollars back from the Veterans home so in the long run it will not be a burden on the tax payers. All three items will be put on the agenda in December.

The next item on the agenda was monthly reports. No questions.

***Motion by Schroeder, seconded by Ravn to approve the monthly board report submitted by Wendorf.

***Carried unanimously.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for December 7, 2016 at 4:15 p.m. at the City Hall.

Re: **Second draft – Potential skate park locations**

Dear Commissioners,

This memo is a follow up to the previous skate park location narrative I drafted. Since our last meeting, the Pine Crest Board of Trustees indicated that they were not interested (and made a motion) in having the "Memorial Rink" property considered for a potential skate park.

There was another site that was brought up (see attached map) that is City owned and could be considered – the eastern most section of the municipal parking lot behind Schmitt & Koppelman Law and immediately west of Center Ave. bridge. This location has a great deal of potential and I think should be heavily considered, along with the other ideas that have been discussed over the past 5 months.

To refresh your memory, and to update the list, I will list those location ideas below:

Festival Grounds (near location where former Humane Society was)
American Legion Building area
Streeter Square
Stange Park
Municipal Parking Lot south of Main Street downtown (eastern most area)

As mentioned in the previous skate park location memo, it is easy to find plenty of pros and cons associated with the above sites (and previous ones we mentioned). I feel that it is important, when looking at a potential park site, to consider a big picture view of that park and its purpose (and intended use – short term and long term) for the entire community. If all things are equal, it would be my opinion to utilize a non-park, city owned location so we do not alter the existing usage or space of a park. This will allow us to "re-purpose" an underutilized location without replacing existing greenspace.




I am pleased to inform you that the City of Merrill's 2016 Stewardship application for the **City of Merrill River Bend East Trail Development** has been tentatively selected to receive a grant in the amount of **\$83,342** from the Acquisition & Development of Local Parks subprogram. The 2016 grant cycle was very competitive. The Department received 71 applications requesting over \$14 million in grant assistance for public outdoor recreation projects.

You were previously also notified of a tentative \$30,408 grant under the Recreational Trail Aids program. Between these two grant programs, we are able to tentatively approve full funding of your original grant request of \$113,750.

This letter represents tentative selection of your project for grant funding. Prior to execution of a final grant agreement, I will work closely with you to update project details and complete all reviews, approvals, and consultations required under applicable federal laws, state statutes, and administrative rules. This award is contingent on successful completion of this review and approval process. Please note that the final grant amount may change based on updated project information and detailed review of eligible project costs. I will contact you shortly to discuss next steps. **You should not purchase any lands, begin construction or other work on your project prior to execution of a signed grant agreement unless you are willing to assume the risk of absorbing those costs.**

If you are no longer interested in receiving this grant, please let me know as soon as possible so that the Department can contact others on the ranked list of projects regarding a tentative grant award.

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December 2016 Parks & Recreation Director's Report

Parks: The unseasonal weather has allowed our crew to accomplish a few tasks that we are not normally allowed to this time of year. It was very nice to be able to continue outside work, however. Some of these tasks include: City Forest trail work, River Bend Bench installations, Disc Golf Basket installations at Kitchenette & Riverside, ADA trail work & paving at all locations, topdressing ball fields, granite trail topdressing, finished a new pedestrian trail directly to the Bierman Family Aquatic Center to name a few. We were also completely prepared for the first snowfall of the season and handled the removal very smoothly. All of our equipment is ready for the upcoming winter season, along with all of our facilities. We have also gathered all picnic tables and other park items back at our shop to allow for winter repairs so they are ready to be used again when spring arrives. We purchased our new trailers that were budgeted for this year and have been using them already. I also will be opening our new tractor bids the day before the Commission meeting for the tractor that we had budgeted for 2016. It took us a while to spec the tractor out completely so the timeline with the class II posting took me right to December 6th. I will provide all of the information and prices at the meeting for you to review and hopefully approve. The new tractor is similar size (but more horsepower) to our 30 year old John Deere and will be used in similar fashion. The old tractor is starting to show some real signs of decline and we will keep it until it is inoperable, as long as we don't have to sink much money into it. The new tractor will hopefully come with a loader and a few other attachments so we can make things more efficient for ourselves. This, of course, is budget dependent. We are also ready and waiting for the consistently cold weather to arrive so we can start to lay water for our outdoor rinks again this year. It is always our goal to have the rinks up and ready in time for Christmas, but weather is always 100% in control of that! I am also very pleased to announce that we were successful with our River Bend Trail Extension Stewardship Grant. We were awarded \$83,342 from Stewardship Funding, and when added to the Recreational Trail Aids program grant we were recently awarded that gives us our full request of \$113,750 for extending the River Bend Trail to the east for approximately 2,700 feet. The \$113,750 amount is the 50% match so I wrote the grant for \$227,500 and they pay us for half of all expenses. It is always great news to be able to continue this wonderful trail and have 50% of that work paid for through grants! We also received the Wisconsin Parks & Recreation Association Award for Outstanding Facility Design for the Bierman Family Aquatic Center for the 2016 season (as I had previously mentioned). This is a very high honor to be recognized by all other Park & Recreation Departments and communities throughout the entire State of Wisconsin and a testament to everyone who had a hand in making our beautiful Aquatic Center a reality!

Forestry: We finished our fall boulevard and park tree plantings, and I am very pleased with everything again this year. As with previous years, we have been very diligent with planting diversity again this year. We were able to focus on a certain area that really needed trees and were able to re-

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stock that neighborhood very nicely. I would like to continue that trend of planting style as it allows for a quicker impact on those areas and also allows us to move onto other areas and have that same impact in subsequent years. As always I need to thank our Park Crew for performing the plantings. Our guys are very good at what they do and they take great pride in everything, and we are all fortunate for that. The Street Department has been catching up on tree trimming and removals that I had for them this year. As always this list is always being added to and we are also fortunate for our cooperative relationship with them. I am currently in the process of my annual documentation and submittal of our 2016 Tree City USA Certification. We will once again qualify for this award with ease, but like everything else, the paperwork they require takes time. Not much news this time of year on the forest health end of things or EAB, but as always I will make sure to keep you informed on what is happening (attachment in your packets).

Smith Center: Ice season is in full swing and thus far we have had a great first month. Things have been going pretty smooth, which is great. We will start having/hosting more games from now through February and tournaments as well so it will only get busier. We are very well equipped to handle it all and look forward to it each season. This is the first season that our high school hockey team is a cooperative with Wausau East – named the “Bluejacks.” So we have welcomed many new families to their new part time Smith Center home. Our Smith Center HVAC upgrades this year were finished in time for the seasons to begin and are working great. Our public skate numbers have been great again this year to date. We hosted two special event public skates, Halloween Skate and Disco Deer, and they were both very successful again this year. We have had some early issues with a select group of misbehaved kids at a few public skates (which unfortunately happens from time to time) but we have handled the issues and behavior has been much better since. We want to make sure our public skate times are welcoming and inviting to any and every one wishing to participate, and we will always ensure that they have that here. We are also hosting our annual Breakfast with Santa on December 10th from 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. in the Community Room of the Smith Center. Bring your families out that morning and enjoy!

Recreation: As previously mentioned we will be hosting Breakfast with Santa in the Smith Center for some holiday fun recreation. Our registrations have been coming in nicely for our Little Dribblers co-ed basketball league that we run starting in January. Hopefully we can continue to build on the great numbers we have been getting the past few years. We are also close to filling up another bus trip, Mall of America on 2/4/17. As always this time of year we also begin the process of laying out and planning for the 2017 Spring/Summer/Fall recreation season. There are a lot of details and planning that needs to go into these programs and this time of year is perfect for preparation.

Note: As we draw close to the end of another year, I would like to sincerely thank our entire staff for another fantastic year! We are extremely fortunate to have a great team assembled here at the Parks & Recreation Department and everything that we do – programs, beautiful parks/facilities/greenspaces, and amenities is a credit to all of our outstanding staff members!!! From the bottom of my heart I would like to thank everyone for making 2016 another success and very much look forward to 2017. Please help me thank them for all that they do!!!
