PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

December 4, 2019

The Merrill Parks and Recreation Commission met on Wednesday, December 4, 2019 at 4:15 p.m. at the Merrill City Hall.

Members Present: Kyle Gulke, Kate Baker, Jean Ravn, Joan Tabor, Brian Artac, and John Vanlieshout.

Members Excused Absent: Dan Novitch

Department Staff Present: Dan Wendorf and Dawn Smith

Visitors: City Administrator Hunter Lane from MP3, Jon Krohn

***Motion by Ravn, seconded by Vanlieshout to approve the minutes from the November meeting.

***Carried unanimously.

***Motion by Vanlieshout, seconded by Ravn, to approve the claims from November.

Public Comment: Jon Krohn introduced himself to the Park and Recreation Commission; he is the new president for the River District Development Foundation.

The next item on the agenda was the 2020 budget update. Wendorf stated the budget has been approved. There were a few items that have to be considered to be put back on the capital items for the 2021 budget. Wendorf stated he would like to start capital planning in February or March.

The next item on the agenda was update and discussion on trail to connect Prairie Trails to the River Bend Trail. Wendorf stated that he has spoken to both Weinbrenner and Fremarq about utilizing their property for entry and exit off the trails. Wendorf stated that both businesses are in support of the new trail. Wendorf will keep the commission updated on trail progress.

The next item on the agenda is to discuss connecting Merrill/River Bend Trail to the Bearskin/Hiawatha State Trail in Tomahawk. Wendorf stated that he has been in contact with the State of Wisconsin about connecting the trail and they are in full support. Wendorf stated that he will have to talk with Tomahawk and the townships between here and Tomahawk to get their full support also. Wendorf stated that the each township would be responsible for maintaining their section of the trail and that would be why everyone would have to be in support of the project. Wendorf will keep everyone updated on progress.

The next item on the agenda was continued discussion on future projects and program ideas. Artac stated that there has been new fencing erected at Athletic Park for improvements. Vanlieshout stated that putting in some IP based security cameras at the parks might be worth looking into to try and prevent vandalism. Vanlieshout stated that they have installed them at the Lincoln County Landfill and there is an app that goes on your phone and you are notified if there is a problem with a break in at one of the parks. Vanlieshout stated that there is also a lot of data stored so you don't have to worry about running out of data. Vanlieshout will check on pricing.

Oak wilt found in Forest Co. and northern townships

Oak wilt has been found for the first time in Forest County and several new northern townships in 2019. These previously undocumented infections were detected using a combination of ground surveys, forester and landowner reports and aerial survey flights. This deadly fungal disease of red oaks has now been confirmed in 65 of Wisconsin's 72 counties.



The new county detection was confirmed after wood samples were taken from two red oak trees in the Town of Lincoln, just north of Lake Lucerne. One sample tree died in 2018 and another was actively wilting at the time of sampling. The samples were then processed in the DNR Forest Health lab where they tested positive for oak wilt.

New township detections in previously confirmed counties include Madge in Washburn County and Namakagon in Bayfield County.

Oak wilt is commonly found in the southern two-thirds of the state and has been creeping northward in recent years. It was found in Oneida County for the first time in 2010. Two years

later, oak wilt was confirmed in Lincoln, Sawyer and Vilas counties followed by Rusk County in 2013, Washburn County in 2014, and Price County in 2015. Oak wilt has been confirmed in all Wisconsin counties except Ashland, Calumet, Door, Iron, Kewaunee, Manitowoc and Taylor.

The highest risk period for overland spread of oak wilt in Wisconsin is April – July. Winter is the safest time to cut and prune oaks, so now through March is a good time to conduct forestry and shade tree care activities that could injure oaks and invite the sap-feeding beetles that transmit oak wilt from infected to healthy trees.



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February 2020 Parks & Recreation Director's Report

Parks: January has surprisingly come and gone very quickly. The weather has been very up and down to say the least. We have had stretches where our snow removal has been difficult to keep up with because of the close intervals of snowfalls, but luckily for us we have a great crew that can get things done pretty efficiently. With the amount of snow and number of snowfalls, we haven't had much time to work on fixing picnic tables and other shop work, but that typically levels out over time so we should be alright in getting things ready for spring when it arrives. The Agra Pavilion rentals have been very busy over the winter months, which is good but it does add another thing for our guys to do with clean up and keeping things tidy in and around the pavilion. We don't have them work the weekends and clean the pavilion, we have left it up to the renters to clean up after themselves. Our guys make sure it is spotless heading into the weekend and again coming out of the weekend. So far this has been working pretty good with very few issues. I met with the Town of Rock Falls Chairperson on 1/16 to discuss the Tomahawk to Merrill trail and he was very supportive of the trail initiative. I also met with the Town of Bradley Chairperson on 1/21 and he was equally supportive of the initiative and both Chairpersons offered to help to see this through. So that makes it a clean sweep from the City of Tomahawk to the City of Merrill in asking permission. I now have to continue to work with the WisDOT to make sure we are following their direction in getting this trail moving, so I will continue working with them to follow the necessary steps. I also met with the City Attorney a few weeks ago to get a draft easement for Weinbrenner for the Prairie Trails to River Bend Trail connector trail. Once that is finished on his end I will take it to Weinbrenner for their review and continue to work with them to get it approved. One ton truck chassis bids were due and opened on 1/23 at City Hall. They are included in your packet and we will discuss and decide at the meeting. We bid our truck along with the Street Department as they are purchasing one as well. The truck and chassis was in the first bid and once we decide on which truck to purchase, we can use that information to get the dump box and hoist ordered to fit that type of truck.


Forestry: The non-stop winter weather has kept the Street Department from being able to do any other tree trimmings or removals. I am really hoping for a "normal" spring in a few months so that they can get out and get caught up from last year and get some progress on a new pruning cycle for this year. A normal spring would also help tree health. Last year especially was a bit rough on our tree stock with the snow pack and fluctuating temps into the spring time. Trees are very resilient but can only take so much extreme weather. As the snow begins to melt, I will be out getting as far ahead on tree inspections as I can before our other job functions get to be too busy.

Recreation: Planning and organizing has been ongoing for the upcoming busy recreation season and as always thanks to Dawn for all of her hard work on all of the details. Our Little Adventures Playgroup, which started on 1/20, is off to a great start. It's a drop in toddler/parent play session in the Community Room in the Smith Center. It will continue every Monday for a few months and will hopefully be a great place for toddlers and their parents to socialize and enjoy themselves. Special thanks to Dawn and Liz for

the great idea and getting this program set up and off the ground. We are hoping to have Summer Recreation programs ready to go by the end of February/early March to be able to promote as early and often as we can to fill up our programs. We will be hosting two events this year for the Badger State Games at our City Forest. On February 8th we will be hosting the Fat Tire Bike Races, and on February 9th we will host the Snowshoe Races. I attended the opening ceremony snowmobile ride stop at Prairie Trails on January 16th to greet BSG representatives and thank them for working with our Department and with our City. I have remained in contact with the BSG Director to hopefully bring more events into our community, as we are always willing to work with anyone at any time to bring new events to our City.

Smith Center: We are still full speed ahead with ice time inside the arena. Our new Arena Specialists are working out great so far and doing a great job. The flooring is finished and so far is working out very well. It took a bit longer for the install but is now finished in all areas that we wanted and we even had a little extra to do a portion of the main entry way. The flooring goes from the entryway through each of the main restrooms and all the way into the Community Room. It is nice for skaters now to finally be able to leave their skates on just about anywhere while they are here. It is also going to be nice on our floors underneath. . . we no longer have to re-paint the floors every few years because they are chipped off or worn out. The new flooring is very durable and we won't have to worry about it for a few decades. We are also looking at picking out carpet tile options for our office to replace the original (25 year old) carpet that really needs to be thrown out. It will be nice to have that done but we are going to wait until ice season is over because we will have to move everything out of the office in order to do it. We hosted another successful varsity hockey tournament a few weeks ago. Merrill Ice Reflections Figure Skating Club will be hosting their annual Figure Skating Show on February 8th and 9th in the Smith Center. They do an amazing job and put on a wonderful show. Things in the Smith Center have been running pretty smoothly which is also a very good thing. It will not be long and we will be talking about removing the ice and getting ready for dry floor events. We have another good year planned for the Smith Center and are very much looking forward to finishing the ice season strong and being ready to go for all other events in 2020 in our beautiful building.
